<b>Directions:</b> Take Hwy 108 over Sonora Pass to Leavitt Meadows trailhead. The trailhead is in the campground, but the parking area is just before the campground entrance.

<b>Meals provided:</b> No. This is a backpacking trip. Individuals are responsible for their own food and drinks.			
<b>Fish: Brook, Rainbow &amp; Cutthroat trout</b>		<b>Fishing strategy:</b> Sight fishing dries in Sierra Lakes that have many Brookies and some Lahontan Cutthroat. Terrestrial dries or nymph fishing in West Walker river.	
<b>Suggested Equipment:</b>	<b>Rod Wt(s)</b>	4-6	
	<b>Line</b>	Floating, optional Sinking or Sink tip	
	<b>Leader</b>	7 or 9', 4x, 5x or 6x works, for example.	
	<b>Tippet</b>	4x – 7x (fish are not shy)	
<b>Suggested Flies:</b>	<b>Patterns/Sizes/etc.</b>	Adam's, Elk Hair Caddis, Grasshoppers work. Lane Lake has many crawfish so Woolly Bugger or Crawfish patterns could be interesting. Roosevelt has cutthroat and feed on damselflies, a sink tip line is helpful. Your favorite is likely to work since the fish in these lakes are hungry. Be sure to have some small stuff, sizes 18-14.	

**Other Gear suggestions:** Rain gear a must. Should be beautiful, but you need to be prepared for Sierra weather which could include thunderstorms. Bring your Tent, sleeping bag/pad, food, bear canister, water/water purification, fishing gear, etc. Don't overdo the equipment, it's a backpacking trip.

**Details/ Comments** This is a backpacking Fishout and requires an individual to carry everything they will need on their backs. The lakes are just 2.5 miles from the trailhead with an elevation gain of 310 feet. There is an option for a day trip to Poore (3.4 miles round trip), Hidden (6 miles) or Fremont Lake (10.2 miles) on Friday or Saturday. We leave Thursday morning, head to Bridgeport to pick up the wilderness permit, then on to the trailhead. We should be able to drive to the trailhead by early afternoon. We can fish the Walker River on the hike in and then make the lakes before dark.
